WORLD PRIEST DAY

I. Overview:

World Priest Day (WPD) is a celebration of Worldwide Marriage Encounter movement's love for our priests and our faithfulness to the Worldwide Marriage Encounter Mission Statement.

We want to support the men who live their Sacrament of Holy Orders each day. This celebration and starter kit helps us as a couple, a family, a local Marriage Encounter Community and our Church with ideas on how to affirm our priests.

Priests have been and are a significant part of our lives. They have ministered to us, preached to us, counseled us, helped to present our weekend, and they continue to journey with us. Let us share our lives, our appreciation and love through suggestions on these pages. There is something here for everyone. Get your children involved. Encourage the young men in your family, in our marriage encounter families, and our church to listen for God's call to be open to become great priests.

Remember you don't have to wait until World Priest Day to do something and you can continue even after that day.

II. Suggestions for Couples and Families to Celebrate World Priest Day

1. Send a card to your parish priest or bishop telling them what their sacrament and/or friendship means to you. A special World Priest Day Note Card is found on page 14 and 15 of this document and can be downloaded for your use.
2. Introduce yourself and family to your priest or bishop you have not met.
3. Invite a priest or bishop you know, or do not know, to breakfast, lunch, or dinner.
4. If you invite them to dinner, you may make it a candle-lighted dinner with china, linens, and maybe soft music. Be creative! Kids could be included in this too! Let the kids help set the table and prepare for his arrival. Or make it a down home barbecue or something unique and special to your family
5. Send them flowers or a balloon bouquet.
6. Invite them on a family picnic and pick them up if possible.
7. If you know a priest or bishop out of town, give them a call; send a note, flowers, balloon bouquet.
8. Bake them cookies, etc. (Kids love to get involved).
9. Have the kids color a picture for them or write them a letter.
10. Invite them to your home.
11. Go on an outing together, such as a dinner and a play, concert, bowling, movie, hunting, fishing, golf, tennis, etc.
12. Cook together in the kitchen.
13. Pray the Prayer Intentions during WPD Day. (Found on page 12 of this document)
14. Be creative and have fun with this special event. Let us know what you dreamed up to honor priests so that we can pass on the ideas.

III. Suggestions that can be used in Parish Wide or Encountered Community Celebrations

1. Put a basket at the Church entry and have parishioners write notes of appreciation, affirmation and support for your Pastor or Associate Pastor. In the note highlight the qualities you most appreciate in your Pastor and your gratitude for his specific impact in your life.
 - a. Announce this event in your Church Bulletin a week before the event (October 31st.)
 - b. Suggested Bulletin Announcement: "Next Sunday is World Priest Day, a day set aside to honor the men who have dedicated their lives to the service of the Catholic Church. As you enter church for mass next weekend there will be a basket for you to place a note (of appreciation, affirmation, support) for our Pastor, Father _____, Your card can highlight the qualities you see in him and the gratitude you have for his dedication and service to your family.
2. Invite your priest or bishop to a dinner hosted by your group or community. It can be as simple or elaborate as you like – the key is building relationships with them.
3. Invite them to a breakfast or lunch.
4. Take time before or after weekend liturgies to recognize and appreciate your pastor.
5. Distribute and use the WPD Prayer found on page 9.
6. Invite them to a picnic hosted by your group or community. Pick them up and bring them.
7. Have a prayer day for your priests or bishop similar to that of a prayer scroll where hours are covered by couples and families. This is a way to pray for deeper relationships between our priests or bishops and our families. See World Priest Day 24 hour prayer intentions on pages 12 and 13.
8. Invite them to a wine and cheese party with your friends and neighbors.
9. Send the "press release" to your Catholic Newspaper. See page 4.
10. Include them in a family night hosted by your group or community.
11. Adopt a seminarian by utilizing some of the suggestions here or some of your own ideas.
12. Send goody baskets, balloon bouquets, or flowers to all priests in the deanery or diocese. Include drawings, notes and prayer bouquets from the kids. Remember to identify that it is sent with love from your group or community.
13. Pray the World Priest Day 24 hour prayer Intentions during World Priest Day and throughout the year.
14. Place an ad in the Catholic Newspaper wishing all priests a happy World Priest Day, complete with WPD logo and WWME logo – or your own creative design. Better yet, get the diocesan, or city newspaper to do an article on WPD! (Don't forget to send us a copy!)
15. Get Catholic Schools or CCD Classes involved in a poster or essay contest or in writing notes to their pastor.
16. Be creative and let us know what you dreamed up.

OUTLINE FOR WORLDWIDE MARRIAGE ENCOUNTER COMMUNITY PRESENTATION

A REFLECTION ON PRIESTS and THE PRIESTHOOD

Can be used to write a presentation to focus on WPD at your community meeting or to choose a few questions for open sharing at your community meeting before WPD

- I. Experience of Priests and the Priesthood
 - A. Growing up
 1. What were my attitudes about priests in general and/or specifically
 2. What were my expectations of priests
 - B. Outlook on priests as an adult
 1. What kind of relationship did you have with the priest who presided at your wedding and after
 2. What has been your involvement (or lack) with priests after your marriage
 3. What were your attitudes about your son(s) becoming a priest before your weekend
 - C. Just prior to your weekend
 1. Did you know a priest would be presenting the weekend
 2. What did you think he was doing on a Marriage Encounter W/E
 3. Thoughts and feelings (describe them) about the priest's presence on the weekend
- II. The Priest on your weekend
 - A. Initial reaction, thoughts and feelings about the priest as the weekend began
 - B. What changes in your attitudes about priests occurred during the weekend
 - C. Share your realization and new view about priests as people
- III. After the Weekend
 - A. What is your view and experience of your parish priest now
 1. Do you find yourself accepting him flaws & all
 2. Share the new attitude in your heart especially when you disagree with him
 - B. What is your view of your parish and fellow parishioners now after the W/E
 1. Do you feel a sense of belonging
 2. Do you want to get more involved
 - C. Relationship with a priest(s)
 1. Have you sought out a friendship with a priest
 - a. What are/were your barriers to seeking that friendship
 - b. How are/did you overcome them
 - c. Briefly describe that journey and your growing relationship with him
 - d. Effects of your relationship with him on you and your family
 - e. Attitudes and feelings now about your son(s) considering the priesthood

Possible Dialogue Questions:

What are my thoughts and feelings about my/our relationship with our priest(s) after listening to this presentation?

What are my thoughts and feelings as we (as a couple, family and share group) approach the celebration of WORLD PRIEST DAY? Describe your feelings in loving detail.

Sharing Question: Share on your dialogue

Priest Appreciation Talk Outline in a Parish or Group Setting

This talk answers the question: How have priests touched and made our lives different?

General:

The goal of this talk is to say thank you to our priests, but more importantly to present to the people of the parish (especially the young men of the parish) an attractive view of the priest hood.

This is why pastors might welcome the talk, because it is a way of validating the call a young man may be experiencing. We must be careful, as some priests and pastors could see this as patronizing, or manipulative. It should never be used for any purpose other than to reflect our appreciation of our priest and the hope of developing and deepening relationships with our priests. In today's world, there are not enough voices saying what a worthy vocation the priesthood is. The louder voices in today's world present negative views of the priesthood, making one wonder why anyone would want to be a priest. We must raise our voices to the contrary for future priests and parents of future priests to hear. This presentation is not limited to Mass only; it can be given at any celebration honoring priests, like a luncheon. It could be given by the local permanent deacon as a part of his homily. Remember it is only a suggestion to give you a head start, so you can work with it and personalize it. If you use it, let us know how it works out.

Nuts and Bolts:

- Talk length: Tailor to what the pastor wants - 2 standard lengths are:
 - 3 - 4 minutes for post communion time
 - 7 - 8 minutes for homily time
- Have both the short and longer version with you – after Father hears the short talk he may ask you to move to homily time for the next Mass and give you more time.

Workshopping:

- We strongly urge any couple giving a talk representing WWME have their talk workshopped by an experienced couple
- Will help you prioritize your sharings, which should be in even the shorter talk and which should be saved for a longer talk
- A fresh pair of eyes will help clarify and trim repetition
- Will help with time factor

Outline:

I. Introduction

Greeting and information on speakers (may be given by priest introducing them)

II. Background on World Priest Day

Your chance to mention WWME. Be prepared and have fliers.

III. Sharing: Your experience of priests & priesthood

A. Childhood

B. If you have a good wedding story include it

C. Adult stories: 1. Some sacramental -- Baptism, 1st communion, loss of loved one

2. Stories to reflect how you changed and reflect the humanness of priests.

D. Thank the priest celebrating the Mass.

Things to avoid

1. Don't make it sound like only WWME couples can have these special experiences of priests, the more relate-able we are to the entire congregation, the better. And don't share stories that leave Father looking like a functionary, even a sacrament story - where you expect Father to impact you, this should be shared in a very personal way.

World Priest Day 24 Hour Prayer Intentions

Here are 24 prayer petitions for priests. In the interest of several people praying together in Spirit, we are asking individuals and couples to lift up that prayer intention during the specified hour if possible. By doing so, each intention hopefully will be offered by several across the nation during that hour. In this way we can be united in our prayer focus by time zone.

12:00 AM: Pray for the health, welfare and spiritual growth of all priests, especially those that have been a gift to you and your family. Name them and visualize them as you pray.

1:00 AM: Pray that those men being called by God to the Priesthood listen and hear that call.

2:00 AM: Pray that priests may strive to be men of prayer so their work may be fruitful.

3:00 AM: Pray that priests may be an instrument for an increase of understanding and unity between the other Christian Churches and the Catholic Church.

4:00 AM: Pray for missionaries in foreign lands that they recognize the fruits of their sacrifice and come to know the love of those to whom they minister and serve.

5:00 AM: Pray for priests that serve the Church in isolated places that they come to experience the love and service of holy men and women in their parishes.

6:00 AM: Pray that Bishops may be open and attentive to the needs of their priests.

7:00 AM: Pray for wisdom, compassion and perseverance for priests in their healing role.

8:00 AM: Pray for retired priests to remain committed in their lifelong vocation of loving God's people.

9:00 AM: Pray that priests may be bonded in brotherhood and strive to overcome differences in age, culture, personality styles and taste.

10:00 AM: Pray for priests who teach in colleges, universities and seminaries that they remain committed to teaching the truth of Jesus.

11:00 AM: Pray for your parish priest and his needs.

12:00 PM: Pray for Pope Benedict XVI, your Bishop, and all the clergy to serve and lead the Church with passion and love.

1:00 PM: Pray for priests who have been unjustly accused of sexual misconduct.

2:00 PM: Pray for priests suffering from discouragement or doubt.

3:00 PM: Pray for priests who God is inviting to minister in Worldwide Marriage Encounter that they may hear the call and answer with open hearts and minds.

4:00 PM: Pray that priests will more fully experience the joy of the privilege of bringing Jesus to the people through the Sacraments of the Church.

5:00 PM: Pray for religious orders that they remain faithful to the vision of their founders as they carry on their ministry.

6:00 PM: Pray for the priest who had the most profound influence on your life.

7:00 PM: Pray for priests caught in addictions for their healing and ability to forgive themselves for their failure.

8:00 PM: Pray that priests pace themselves in a healthy manner in face of ever increasing workloads and assignments.

9:00 PM: Pray for priests experiencing physical pain or disease.

10:00 PM: Pray for a healthy balance of prayer, service and relaxation among the priests of our nation and the world.

11:00 PM: Pray that priests experience joy and peace through their participation in the lives of those they serve.

12:00 PM: Pray that the lived witness of priests will inspire young men to hear and accept God's call to the priesthood.



BLESSING FOR A PRIEST

This blessing is for use at a Sunday Liturgy on World Priest Day or any weekend during the month of October. Following the Prayer after Communion, a member of the parish pastoral council or any parish member(s) leads the community in blessing the Priest.

During the month of October we celebrate World Priest Day. Priests daily use the gifts of healing, counseling, preaching and celebrating the Eucharist to and for the benefit of Catholics everywhere. We pause today with a special prayer for Father _____, asking God to continue to bless him in his ministry. I invite you now to extend your hands toward Father as I (We) lead a prayer of blessing.

All in the assembly extend their hands as the leader continues:

All honor and glory to you, Lord our God, maker of all and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. In your faithfulness and love, you sent your only Son to live with us and to save us by giving his life for us.

Today we offer you thanks and praise for choosing Father _____, to be filled with the Spirit of Jesus as he leads your flock with zeal and wisdom. We ask you to give him your fullest blessing in his priestly ministry. Help him to serve others as generously as Jesus did, in times of sorrow and in times of joy.

Caring God, bless Father _____, so that he may nourish us with your Word, lead us in prayer and worship, and sustain us as a shepherd and father.

Saving God, bless Father _____, so that he may instruct us by his teaching, inspire us by his preaching, and encourage us by word and deed to work with him for the good of our parish.

Loving God be close to your servant Father _____, as he follows your Son. Guide him in paths that are level and smooth. May your powerful grace make him strong in faith, joyful in hope, and fervent in love, this day and every day to come. We ask this through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

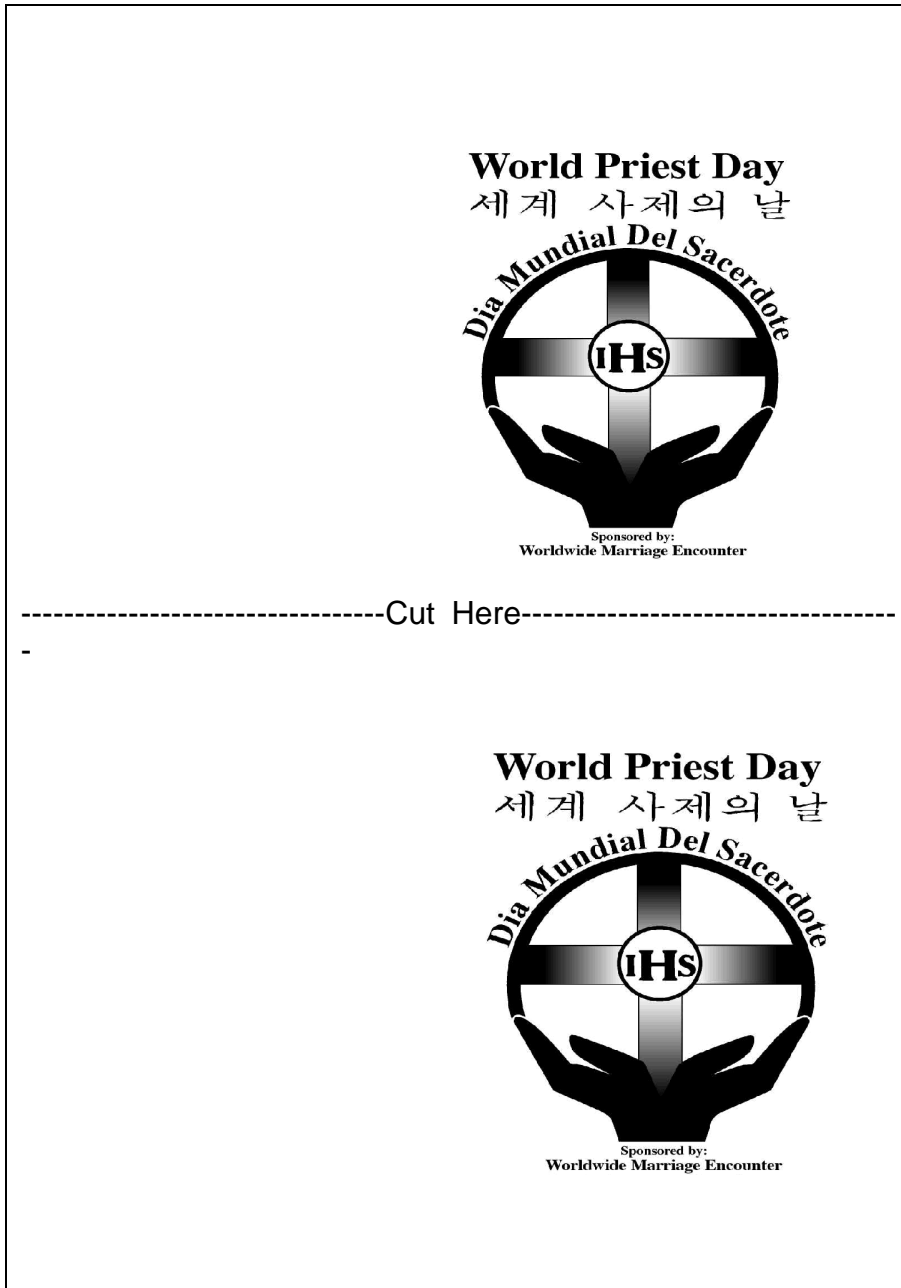

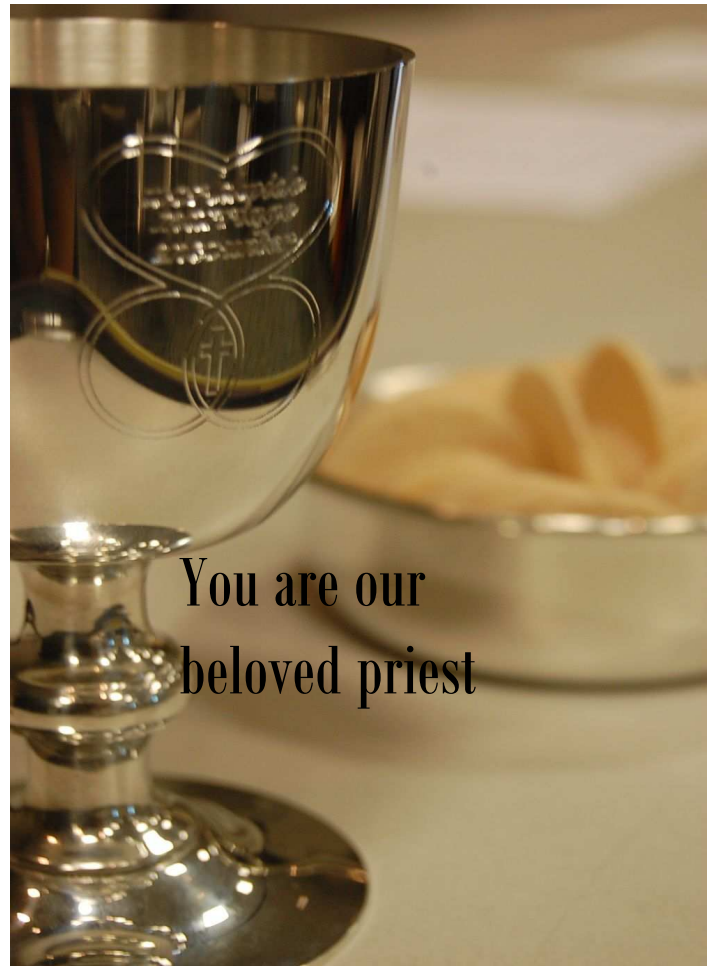
